Assignment Policies

Course Construction

- Courses at Haney are broken down into sections known as Occupational Completion Points, or OCP's.
- Completion of an OCP earns a certificate.
- Students must complete each OCP with an average of at least 80%.
- Each OCP is further broken down into 'Grade Sheets' reflecting the current content focus.
- Haney receives funding based on OCP completion.

Formative Assignments

- Formative assignments are non-test assignments that are used to build your skills.
- Formative assignments are not turned in to the instructor.
- Students are responsible for evaluating their own performance on formative assignments.

Test Taking

- When you are ready to take a test, see the Instructor.

- No books or notes may be used during tests.
- If you score below a 70, and completed the formative assignments for the section, you may retake the test. The scores will be averaged.

Academic Misconduct

- Do not copy another students work, whether it is formative, a test or a project.
- Do not copy materials from outside sources and submit them as your own creations.
- Students caught cheating will be subjecting themselves to severe penalties, up to and including dismissal from the program without refund.

Individual Learning

- Make sure you read your assignments
- If you need a clarification on instructions, ask!
- When you hit a snag, don't give up!
- Remember, you're not alone, you have help available!
- What to do when stuck:
- Reread the instructions.
- Re-try the step.
- Search the online or program help for assistance.
- Back up and work through the problem again.
- Ask the instructor for help.

Employability

- Counts for 15% of your grade.
- Includes
 - attendance & punctuality
 - dress code
 - class policies
 - > behavior
- Each day you are out of dress code and each time you violate classroom policy, you will lose 5 points off of your employability grade.

Time Management

Daily Schedule

Sign In / Out

- ✤ You must sign in each time you enter class.
- You must sign out each time you leave class, including lunch.
- The pass to leave class will function as your sign in/out for when you need to be out of the room.

Break Policy

- Students do not receive a scheduled 'break'
- Students leaving the classroom must have a pass.
- Students may leave the classroom to go to the restroom or water fountain without a pass.

Smoking Breaks

It is neither Bay District School Board policy nor Haney Technical Center policy for Adult students to be given a 'smoke break.'

Attendance

- Attendance for adults is based upon hours in the classroom.
- Your attendance has tremendous effect upon your financial aid!
- There are <u>NO</u> excused or unexcused absences.
- Students will be dropped after six consecutive days of absence, missing 10% of their scheduled classroom time, or 9 absences in one payment period.
- Students dropped will have to file an appeal to re-enroll in classes the following year and likely lose financial aid.

Punctuality

- The classroom will open five minutes before class begins.
- If class starts at 11:20, that is the time you are to be in the classroom ready to begin.
- Your punctuality reflects upon your employability.
- Your employability is part of your grade.
