• Demonstrate how to provide bio-psycho-social support (which can be accomplished through a combination of simulation, laboratory, and clinical settings in accordance with F.S.464.019).

Classroom Attendance Policy

The maximum absences allowable for any Practical Nursing student will be 30 hours during the course of the program. When a student has missed 15 hours, an additional warning will be issued. If a student misses more than the allowed 30 hours, the student will be automatically withdrawn.

Classroom Policies

Students must dress for the occupation for which they are being prepared. Practical Nursing students will wear the uniform adopted by the program. Uniforms must be clean and well pressed. Students will adhere to the dress code in the clinical facility. In the classroom and clinical setting, students will wear their uniform. Female students must wear a bra. Students must wear shoes at all times. Any student in violation of the dress code will be sent to administration. Students must wear their Haney issued name badge while on campus and in the clinical setting. This is considered part of the uniform. Any student present without his/her name badge will be sent home. Smoking is not allowed on the school campus. No personal calls are to be made or accepted during class or during clinical hours. The student will adhere to the policy on student conduct as described in the Haney Technical Handbook.



Grading Policy
